


# The Sandbag Battery, November 5th, 1854, The Battle of Inkermann, Crimea

# Crimean War - Sandbag Battery KIA

The Battle of Inkerman on the morning of 5 November 1854 has been described as "The Soldier's Battle" in reference to the sheer ferocity of the fighting, and the small parties of men who fought in isolation in the freezing and foggy conditions.

Pauloff's force of 15,000 men advanced down the axis of the post road towards the northern and north eastern sides of Home Ridge and Fore Ridge. The main focal points of the battle became the Barrier, The Sandbag Battery and the crest of the ridge above them.

The defence of the Sandbag Battery took place in thick fog against overwhelming odds and is one of the epics of British military history. Continued Page 2

The Russians launched 7,000 men against the Sandbag Battery, which was defended by 2,000 British soldiers, including the Guards Brigade with a strength of 1,215 under Major General Henry Bentinck.

**The Guards Brigade was comprised of:** 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, Grenadier Guards – 405

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Coldstream Guards - 438

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Scots Fusiliers Guards-372

On that day the Guards Brigade lost nearly half their numbers in the space of an hour It was a particularly iconic battle for the Grenadier Guards, 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, Queen Victoria's premier Foot Guard regiment, who were the only regiment to take their Colours into the battle.

Cut off and isolated from the rest of their Division, the Grenadier Guards defended the Sandbag battery and beat off repeated determined attacks. The Colour Party was surrounded and was reduced to 100 men. The Colours were passed from hand to hand, regardless of rank, as they fought through a mass of Russians, all bent on the capture of the precious symbols of a British Regiment.


#### The Adjutant, Captain Higginson, later General Sir George Higginson, described the scene:

"Clustered round the Colours, with scarcely a round of ammunition left, the men pressed slowly backwards, keeping their front full towards the enemy, their bayonets ready at the charge. As a comrade fell, wounded or dead, his fellow took his place and maintained the compactness of the gradually diminishing group that held on with unflinching stubbornness in protecting the flags. More than once from the lips of this devoted band of non-commissioned officers and rank-and-file came the shout, "Hold up the Colours!" The intense hand-to-hand fighting lasted 6 hours but they eventually managed to fight their way back to the British lines. The Battery had changed hands seven times. There were so many acts of bravery that the Grenadier Guards <u>3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion</u> earned three VCs that day.

At the end of the battle they had suffered 234 dead and wounded, a casualty rate of almost 60%. Amongst the more than 100 dead was Private Walter Gathercole.

#### 6393. Private. Walter Gathercole. 3rd Battalion, Grenadier Guards. Killed-in-Action 5th November 1854.

Walter Gathercole was born in Cressingham, near Swaffham in Norfolk in 1833. He enlisted into the Grenadier Guards on 30 November 1852. At the time of his formal attestation at King's Lynn on 2 December 1852 he is shown as being 19 years of age and having worked as a Gamekeeper. Served for 1 year and 339 days before his death in action while defending the famous Sandbag Battery at Inkermann on 5th November 1854. Continued Page 4
