"Hamilton Gault walked, or rather limped with one leg gone. Its so sad, "Then they came back but not the six hundred." Imstead, they are lying on the battlefields of France - not lost though, but living in imperishable time, in Canada's story. Ideals for the generation to come."

#### Editors Notes.



#### Book report;

Tapestry Of War by Sundra Gwyn

I happened to be prowsing in the local libary when I came across this book and could not put it down. The author has taken diaries, letters and newspaper articles from many different Canadians and weven them into an incredible story. Starting at the beginning of this century, the story of our nation unfolds. The author uses civilian, political and war stories to take you through the First World War. Ethel Chadwick, a young Ottawa girl describes the carefree life before the clouds of war decent on everyone. Hamilton Gaults memoirs describe the raising to the PPCLI Regiment and a number of members share thier daily lives. The political back stabbing and the resulting turned leaves you wandering how the allies wan this horrible war. Interspersed amongst this are hundreds of factoids about the war and the people fighting it. One example that amazed me was that the leaders were worried about the abundant use of cocaine by many in the Allied Army. The story of Talbot Papineau through his poetic letters home, and his ultimate death leaves you shocked. This was a man who was to become Prime Minister and believed so strongly in the unity of Canada. Hundreds of photographs and illistrations enliven the book and gives you a better sense of being there. This is a must read for military buffs.

Princess Patricia's design for her regiment's cap and collar badges. The single daisy was in honour of Hamilton Gault's wife, Marguerite. Later, the design was to cause problems and would be changed.









On February 21, 1919, Princess Patricia, Colonel-in-Chief of the PPCLI reviewed her regiment for the last time before it returned to Canada, Agar Adamson is on her right in both photographs. Princess Patricia married the following week and renounced her royal title. As Lady Patricia Ramany she remained Colonel-in-Chief until her death in 1974.
